This will most likely result in lowered income and we will have to reduce the number of staff employed from 7 to 4. Our business would still struggle but we would be forced to consider its profitability and we may even close it down. That will put unbearable pressure on the south east corner for government services, etc. which the government will be unable to provide. Surely it would be better to keep services and population in rural areas than to impose this madness on north Queensland as electricity price increases, as we all know, just go to fill state government coffers. The State Government would be better of finding ways of cutting costs than increasing the tax burden on rural Queensland
