Aurizon Network's extension draft amending access undertaking: notice of investigation

On 14 April 2016, we received Aurizon Network's application for a draft amending access undertaking (the April 2016 extension DAAU). The application seeks approval to extend the terminating date of your 2010 access undertaking until the earlier of 30 September 2016 or the date on which the QCA approves a replacement undertaking. The application was lodged with us in accordance with section 142(1) of the *Queensland Competition Authority Act 1997* (Qld) (QCA Act).

Section 146 of the QCA Act requires us to provide you with a formal notice if we propose to conduct an investigation, and invite written submissions. This letter is to advise that we intend to conduct such an investigation before we decide whether to approve, or refuse to approve, the extension DAAU.

Under section 143(3) of the QCA Act, the QCA may only approve a DAAU if, among other things, we have published the DAAU and invited persons to make submissions on it, and considered those submissions.

We have published the extension DAAU on our website (www.qca.org.au) and sought submissions from interested parties. The due date for submissions is 26 May 2016. A submissions page is attached for your consideration, should Aurizon Network wish to make a submission.

The QCA will publish this letter for stakeholders' information.
