Background

• Tarong pipeline has some irrigators that take high priority water from the pipeline.

Pricing Framework

Tariff Structure

- Irrigators receive a large bill from SunWater in drought years when irrigators aren't
 getting any water. In drought years a large amount of irrigator's funds are used up by
 water bills.
- High Priority stock and domestic users have had no say in what the charges should be, despite being allocated a large amount of costs.

Pricing

• The appropriateness of the government policy that was maintaining revenues in excess of costs, even when the ARR balance was positive, was questioned.

Other

- If SunWater owns the water that flows through the rivers, then it should be responsible
 for flood damage but no compensation is given to people for the damage caused by
 flooding.
- SunWater's dam is not considered to provide any additional benefit. SunWater's costs keep rising all the time.
