

Solar feed-in tariff in regional Queensland, 2026-27

Overview of the final determination

The Treasurer, Minister for Energy and Minister for Home Ownership asked us to set a flat-rate solar feed-in tariff (FiT) for regional Queensland in 2026-27. This fact sheet summarises our final determination.

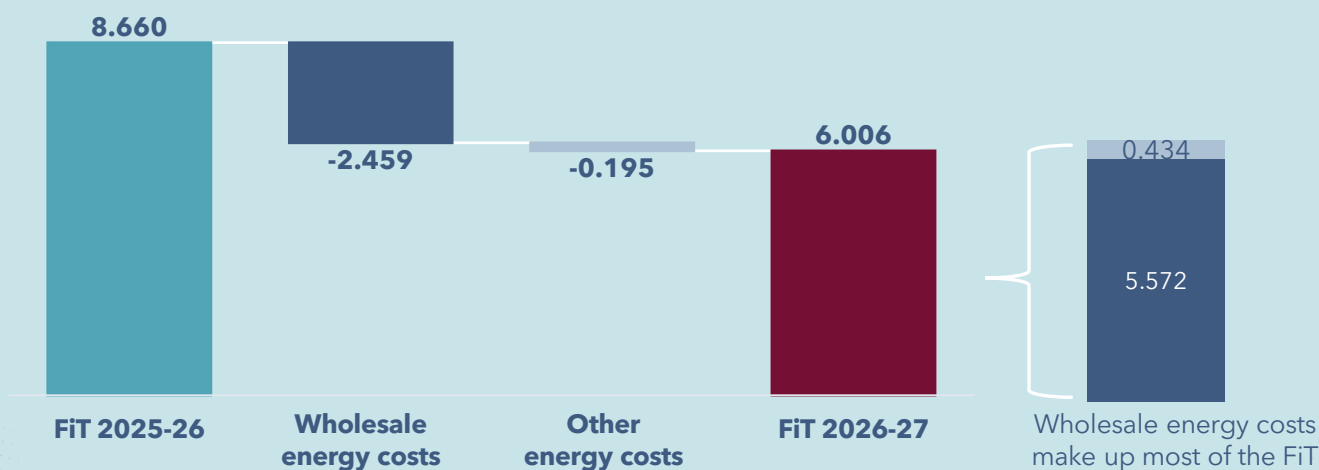
Key takeaways

- We estimated a solar FiT of **6.006 c/kWh** in regional Queensland for 2026-27. This is 31% lower than the current rate of 8.660 c/kWh.
- This reduction reflects a decrease in energy costs and the availability of additional solar export data from advanced digital meters (ADMs) – which allows us to better measure and value exported solar energy.
- The solar FiT will apply from **1 July 2026**.

Avoided cost methodology

- When retailers source energy from solar customers instead of the National Electricity Market, they avoid costs they would otherwise incur.
- We estimate the solar FiT using an avoided cost methodology. For 2026-27, we applied the same approach as last year, using additional data now available on solar exports from ADMs.

Customers should not expect the solar FiT to remain the same when deciding whether to install or upgrade PV systems. The solar FiT is updated each year to reflect changes in energy costs and any new information that becomes available.
